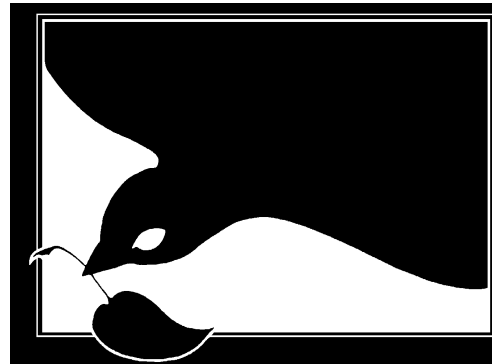


Mediation Skills Training Institute for Church Leaders
